## **Review of 2016/2017**

# Year 7 Catch Up Premium Report: The Beacon

The Department for Education has made available additional funds for improving the attainment of pupils in Year 7 who may be at risk of underachieving. This is known as the Year 7 Catch-Up Premium. The funds are primarily aimed at improving Maths and English levels. This report summarises how the 2016-17 funding was spent and how we intend to spend this year's funding. Most importantly, it provides information on the outcomes of the spending and the improvements made amongst our pupils

**Objective:** To support transition into KS3 and enhance the progress of pupils in Year 7 and aid their progression across the Secondary curriculum.

Please note: Whilst the national expectation was that the catch-up premium should support pupils moving to level 4 by the end of Year 7 all our Year 7 pupils have additional special education needs and are working more than two whole levels below this at the end of Key Stage 2. Therefore, progression to level 4 over the course of Year 7 is an unrealistic expectation. When evaluating the impact of the premium we therefore consider expected progress and the development of additional skills such as resilience and independent working, which have a massive impact upon pupil progress throughout Key Stages 3 and 4.

#### **Summary of Spending at The Beacon Folkestone 2016-2017**

Has focused in staffing to facilitate: High staff to pupil ratio – the year 7 class size at The Beacon in Tier 1 is 10 pupils with 1 teacher and 2.5 experienced teaching assistants (two classes). In Tier 2 the year 7 are in mixed classes, shared between 2 teachers and 4TA's. Small group teaching in English and Maths lessons. Highly differentiated curriculum. Focus lessons on phonics and group/guided reading and supported writing and developing Social skills

We have purchased sensory, physical and concrete resources and IT equipment to support access to the Maths and English Curriculum.
