Locality Model for SEN Inclusion



KCC are proposing to establish a Locality Model for Special Educational Needs (SEN) Inclusion in Kent, which would help drive necessary countywide improvements to mainstream inclusion and education, for children and young people aged 5 to 16 years old with SEN.

The proposed Model, would mean SEN support and services being accessed and delivered in a new way, making better use of local education and SEN expertise. The ambition is that children and young people's needs are identified accurately and assessed in a timely and effective way, so they receive the right support.

Autism and Girls

Who is this training for? Educational Staff, SENCos and Other Professionals.

What will you learn?

- This course will provide an understanding of Autism and the differences between the male and female presentation.
- We will consider the impact of these characteristics on diagnosis and the risk factors that are experienced in daily life for girls with ASC.
- Strategies to support girls in education from Early Years to Secondary will be introduced with time given for discussion and supportive conversations
- Delegates will have an increased awareness of:
- Prevalence of girls and ASC- history and research overview
- Co-morbidity with other conditions
- How can girls with ASC present differently to boys?
- How can we best support girls with ASC? Key strategies
- A range of materials/resources which are girls and ASC specific (including puberty)

DEVELOPMENTAL CO-ORDINATION DISORDER – Webinar

Audience: SENDCOs and Class Teachers (primary and secondary)

WHEN:

Tuesday 6th February 2024 9.30 - 11.30

Monday 10th June 2024 1.30 - 3.30

This training session is for primary and secondary schools where a CYP has been identified as having both gross motor and fine motor co-ordination difficulties but does not necessarily have a diagnosis. There may also be other difficulties associated with their needs, eg specific learning difficulties (dyslexia/dyscalculia), personal organisation difficulties, visual-spatial difficulties as well as practical tasks.

- Early identification and interventions
- Recognising other associated difficulties, eg ADHD, ASD
- Practical strategies for managing fine motor tasks including handwriting and note-taking
- Inclusion in PE for CYP with co-ordination difficulties
- Managing homework
- Planning for inclusion in PE
- Personal organisation (including dressing, time management and orientation)
- Visual perception
- Adjustments for examinations
- Self-esteem and emotional wellbeing
- NB we will not be giving strategies around specific learning difficulties such as dyslexia and dyscalculia
